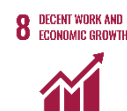
The Institution

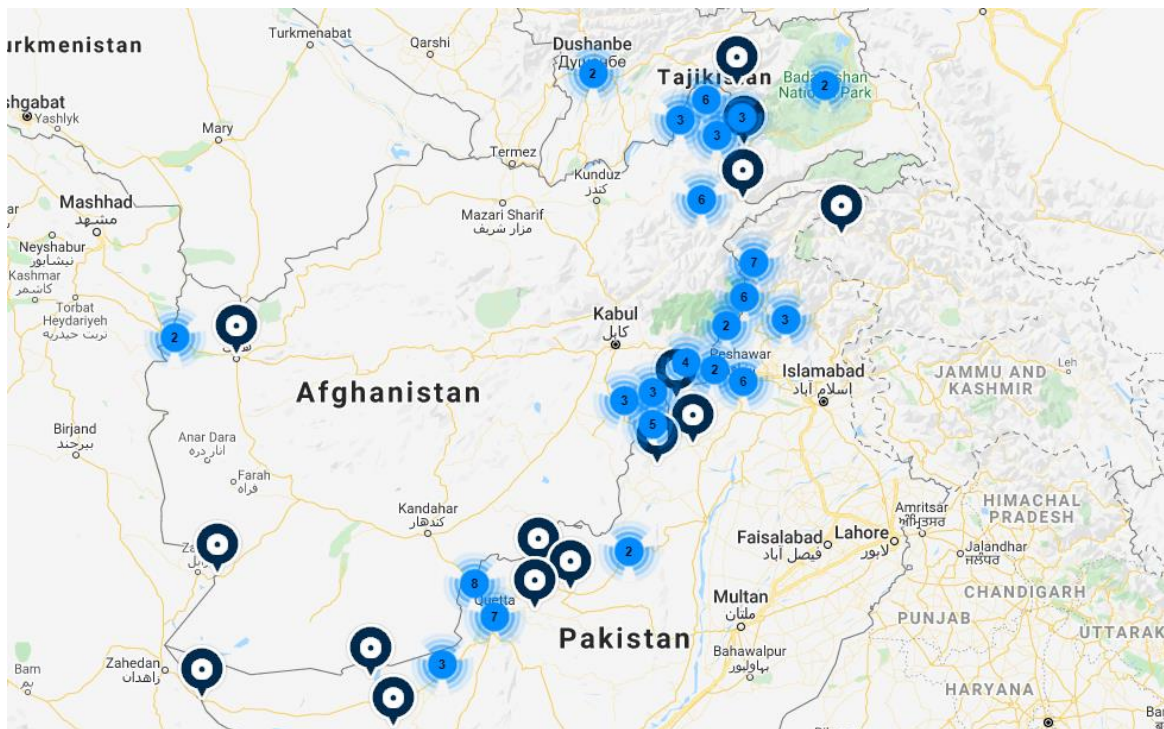

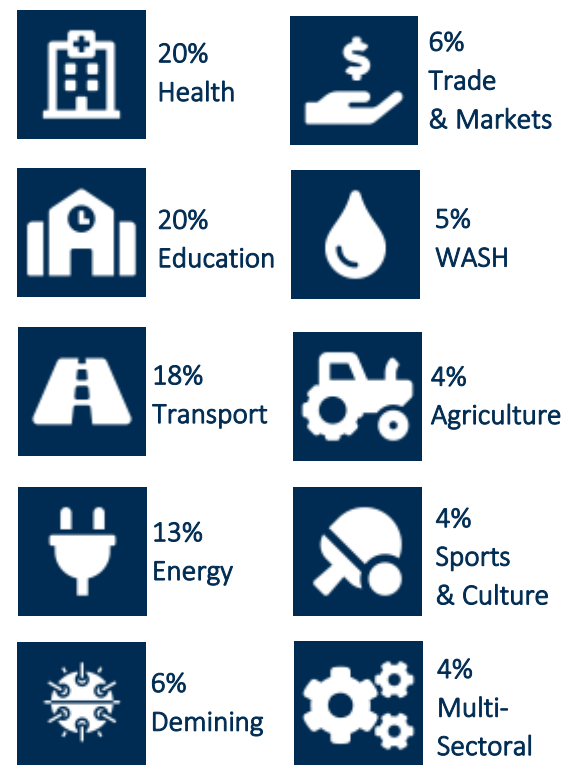

The PATRIP Approach

Allocating Funds through Local Partners

The PATRIP Foundation acts as a trust fund manager, pooling funds and coordinating implementation partners to enhance cross-border exchange and provide stability in border areas of fragile states. The partners consist of both international and national non-governmental organisations that meet PATRIP's criteria.

Actively Involving Local Communities

The PATRIP Foundation's implementation partners facilitate coordination with local authorities. Projects reflect the priorities of the local inhabitants and are aligned with local development plans. They are realised by the Foundation's partner NGOs in close collaboration with the community itself.

Sharing Responsibility for Monitoring

PATRIP's Monitoring Team is responsible for technical and accounting assistance and the monitoring of expected results. The locally based team conducts regular visits to the project sites and partner agencies to verify the construction quality and offer advice on possible improvements, and regularly reviews project expenditures and progress reports.

Reinforcing Sustainability

The responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the (re-)installed infrastructure is clarified before funding starts. The partners establish whether operation and maintenance can be carried out solely by the local community or the local administration accepts responsibility.
